John's Jogs: KEEP THE UNITY OF THE SPIRIT THROUGH THE BOND OF PEACE

It is extremely important as we seek to find the right replacement pulpit minister that we keep this in mind. That has been one of the valuable ingredients in the strength of the Champions congregation. We have been unified and we need to build on that record. I call your attention to Ephesians 4:1...

"I....beseech you to walk worthy of the calling to which you were called, with all lowliness, and gentleness, with longsuffering, bearing with one another in love, endeavoring to keep the unity of the Spirit in the bond of peace. There is one body and one Spirit, just as you were called in one hope of your calling; one Lord, one faith, one baptism; one God and Father of all, and in you all...He Himself gave some to be apostles, some prophets, some evangelists and some pastors and teachers, for the perfecting of the saints for the work of ministry and the edifying of the body of Christ, till we all come to the unity of the faith and knowledge of the Son of God."

Paul introduces this chapter with five great

virtues which shine like jewels in the first three verses. First and foremost is the virtue of humility followed by meekness or gentleness. The third great quality of the Christian is long-suffering (patience).

The fourth great virtue is the quality of love. These four issue into a fifth and that fifth is peace. If every member of this congregation absorbs all these qualities into our lives, we will build one of the greatest congregations in Houston.

Paul goes on to establish the basis for Christian Unity:

- 1. There is one body. Christ is the head and the church is His body. No brain can work through a body which is disintegrated and un-coordinated and fragmented.
- 2. There is one Spirit. The vitalizing breath of the body is the Spirit of Christ. It is the operation of the Spirit in the body that gives it life and keeps it alive.
- 3. There is one hope in our calling. Our

- only hope is in Jesus Christ. There is salvation in no other name. Therein is our hope.
- 4. There is one Lord. Christians are joined together because they are all in the possession and in the same service of the one Master and Lord.
- 5. There is one faith. Paul here means Christians are bound together as one because they all have made one common act of surrender to the will & love of Jesus.
- 6. There is one baptism as a burial in water in the name of the Father, Son and Holy Spirit for the remission of sins rising to walk a new life in Christ.
- 7. There is one God The Christian's idea of God begins in love and belief that we live in a God-created, God-controlled, God-sustained and God-filled world.

If we are ever to be united and pleasing in God's sight – we must understand the oneness in Him.
