In the horror of the fires in California, there was a story that intrigued me. One gentleman, being interviewed, was recounting his terrifying experience. He had been in his car, trying to escape the fast-approaching flames, when his escape came to a screeching halt. Cars were stopped in front of him and were quickly stacking up behind him. He was literally "stuck in traffic."

With the flames just feet from his car and the heat so intense that the rubber around the windows was melting, he knew he had to try to escape the fire on foot. As he ran toward the front of the line of stopped vehicles, a woman in a pickup stopped and told him to get in. She then drove him to safety and in the process stopped for 9 more—all squeezing in to make room for the next. The man told his interviewer that he never even got the woman's name.
