## John's Jogs: THE GOSPEL OF JOHN (JOHN 3:16) The Reality of Condemnation

#### **SEVENTH:**

The verse next presents the reality of condemnation. "For God so loved the world. that He gave His only begotten Son, that whoever believes in Him shall not per*ish...*" (emphasis mine). Condemnation, spiritual death, and eternal hell: This verse of amazing love indicates that these concepts are realities. John 3:16 implies that hell is fact, not fiction.

Although this expression is found late in the verse, it implies the very situation that made it necessary for God to send His Son. Why did God send Jesus? So that people might not perish. That tells us that people would have perished without Him. Until He came, all sinners were doomed to perish.

The very next verse says. "For God did not doomed to eternal condemnation – besend the Son into the world to judge the world, but that the world might be saved through Him" (3:17). Why did Jesus' coming not condemn the world? Because the world was already condemned. Jesus offered then, and offers now, the only hope for the world, in its past and present state of condemnation. Therefore, anyone who chooses to reject Jesus is condemned because he has rejected the only way out of the state of condemnation in which he finds himself. (See 3:18).

Why are we condemned? There is just one reason: A man is condemned because of his own sin. We read, "All have sinned," and "the wages of sin is death" (Romans 3:23; 6:23). Therefore, we are all condemned sinners - dead spiritually and

cause of our own sin.

The destiny of those who do not escape this condemnation will be a lake that burns with fire and brimstone (Revelation 21:8). In that place, those who have been condemned will experience eternal agony, where the worm does not die and the fire is not quenched (Mark 9:44, 46. 48). Further, every person who has sinned (that is, everyone) deserves to be there.

Nevertheless, God has provided a way out, and that is the good news of the gospel. The way out is through Jesus. If we will believe in Him, trust in Him, commit ourselves to Him, and obey Him, we can escape that condemnation!
