# A Special Letter

Have you ever received a note or message from someone special? It is amazing how much a note, email, letter, or message from someone close to us can brighten our spirits and change our day. I know we don't send letters as much as we used to, but imagine what it must have been like to receive a letter when there was no phone, internet, text messaging, etc. A person could go months without being able to communicate with people they care about. Receiving a letter would have been a very exciting time.

That's what it was like for our first century brethren when they received a letter. I was reading the book of Philippians and couldn't help but think about this idea. The church at Philippi had a special relationship with the apostle Paul. Listen to how Paul describes the church there: "Therefore, my beloved and longed-for brethren, my joy and crown....." (Ph. 4:1). Paul had a longstanding relationship with the church at Philippi. We first read of Paul's work there in Acts 16. The church helped support Paul throughout his ministry. In fact, they sent Epaphroditus some supplies to help support Paul (Ph. 4:18).

When you read this letter, one can tell of the love he had for them. He is writing a letter from his heart to people he loves and cares about. Can you imagine how excited the church there must have been when they received his letter? How about the anticipation of the letter being read as word spread of its arrival? The letter would have been read in its entirety to the church. I would suspect that everyone at the church who could be there for the reading was present. It would have been something that was greatly anticipated and met with joy.

If we are not careful, it can be easy for us to take for granted the fact that we have the complete and written Word of God so easily at our fingertips. Most of us probably have several written copies, a copy on our computer, iPad and smartphone. The question is do we have that same excitement for God's Word that the church at Philippi must have had when they received Paul's letter?

We should long to read God's word, to study it, and to meditate on it. Psalm 1 gives us a contrast between a righteous man and the way of the ungodly. In that Psalm, we can read how God's Word should be to us. "But his delight is in the law of the Lord, and in His law he meditates day and night" (Ps. 1:2). Are we excited to study God's Word, to be at Bible class, to hear lessons proclaimed from the pulpit? Let's make sure our delight is in the law of the Lord!

# John's Jogs: The Overshadowed Super Star - Barnabas

We tend to think of Peter and Paul as the super stars of the book of Acts and they are. But I believe there is a third overshadowed superstar in this book. We see this in politics where we see people who could never be elected but can produce leaders who can be elected. We see sports people overshadowed by others. For example, take Lou Gehrig. He was one of the alltime great baseball players but was completely overshadowed by the one and only great Babe Ruth. Few people know that in 1927 the year Ruth hit 60 home runs Gehrig hit 57.... Ruth had 417 total bases Gehrig had 447 .... Ruth had 138 RBIs Gehrig had 175.....For years Gehrig held the record for most games played as well as most consecutive games. As team-mates their overall life time records are very close,

except Ruth was a pitcher for a time. It is generally believed that Gehrig would scarcely be known except for the way he died. It took his rare illness (Lou Gehrig's Disease) to get the recognition he so richly deserved.

We even see this over shadowing in the apostles. There are the two brother apostles – Andrew and Peter. We hear very little of Andrew, for his brother is in the limelight. But did you ever stop to think that Peter might not have ever even been a Christian if Andrew had not run to tell him he had found the Christ. I'm afraid that we often are awed by the miracles of the early church and miss the true lesson of their humanity.

As the tempestuous fiery oratory of the apostle Peter was needed for the beginning of the church and its early days in Judea....and the articulate well educated Paul was needed to carry the message into the Roman World.....So the seasoned wisdom of the stable Barnabas was needed for the transition....Because of their more explosive styles Barnabas is overshadowed by these two giants....But in value to the church and its outward thrust, his worth may have equaled theirs. We'll consider three of the works in which Barnabas was engaged as we look for some of the characteristics he displayed that reveal his greatness. That's next week.
