John's Jogs: BEHOLD THE MAN

Christ's crucifixion is portrayed in John 19. "Jesus then came out, wearing the crown of thorns and the purple robe. Pilate said to them, 'BEHOLD THE MAN!" (19:5). As we look at Jesus during His trial and crucifixion, what do we see:

WE SEE A DEATH FOR OTHERS: We see Jesus as, One, who was scourged not because of His wrong doings, but on our behalf. Peter said, alluding to Isaiah 53:5, "by His wounds you were healed" (1 Peter 2:24). The stripes with which He was beaten were really meant for you and me. We deserve them; but Jesus suffered and died in our stead. He was sinless, yet he died for others – for you and me and the rest of mankind.

WE SEE THE DEATH OF A KING: We

see a king who was crucified as a common criminal. After Pilate found Jesus innocent, the Jews said, "He made Himself out to be the Son of God" (19:7). Perhaps the most surprising thing we see at the cross is the King of God's kingdom. The King of kings, and Lord of lords (I Tim 6:15), the ruler of the universe, dying the most shameful and hurtful death imaginable! His death demonstrated that Jesus was not the usual kind of king and His kingdom was not the usual kind of kingdom. Rather He was establishing a spiritual kingdom.

WE SEE A DEATH ACCORDING TO GOD'S PLAN: We see One whose death seems to have been caused by forces beyond His control, but who in reality died according to God's plan? John was concerned about showing that Jesus' death

fulfilled the scriptures. He wanted to show that Jesus' death was no accident. It did not just happen by chance. Everything that Jesus suffered was part of God's plan for man's redemption. Jesus was crucified by the hands of lawless men and did so "by the predetermined plan and foreknowledge of God" (Acts 2:23) NASB.

WE SEE A DEATH THAT COMPLET-ED JESUS' WORK: He said, "It is finished, bowed His head and gave up His spirit (19:30). Jesus had overcome every obstacle, every temptation. In His death He had accomplished what He had come to earth to do. He had won! He had beaten the devil, triumphed over sin, done the will of the Father and gained salvation for mankind. "It is finished!" Was a cry of victory!
