The prophet Isaiah wrote, "For my thoughts are not your thoughts, neither are your ways my ways, declares the Lord. Their anger carries over and a great persecution arises against the church in Jerusalem. As a result, the church is scattered (Acts 8:1). You and I can only imagine how dark a day that must have been for those members of the church.

In the midst of these terrible events, God was at work. Those people that were scattered ended up traveling as far as Antioch (Acts 11:19). They began "preaching the Lord Jesus" and God worked with them in this process (Acts 11:20-21). What was the result of their work? "A great number who believed turned to the Lord (Acts 11:21). The church was started in Antioch. These people continued to teach others and the church there continued to grow. It is here in this church that the "disciples were first called Christians" (Acts 11:26). A title that you and I can still wear today.

God was at work in what was a very difficult time. This story is only one example of many that we could look at in scripture to remind us of God's sovereignty. The important thing for us to remember is that no matter what we are facing, no matter what we may be experiencing, God is always at work and He is always in control!

John's Jogs: MY DAD

I lost my Dad in July 1940 (79 years ago) when I was 13 years old. Today, I can go into another room and can't remember why I came there. Yet there are many things about my Dad that I can remember as if they were yesterday. He was born near Cookeville, Tennessee in 1888 the youngest of 11 children. His Dad was wounded in the Civil War and his mother was one-half Cherokee Indian. Dad's oldest sister was born in 1867. His first wife bore him a daughter and two sons before she died leaving him 3 young children. His second wife died after 7 months. My mother then died when I was 2 years old. The way I figure his three wives combined only lived 10-12 years. Fortunately for me and him, my sister was 18 when my mother died.

My Dad suffered with a severe case of asthma before the medical community understood its nature. Thus my memory of him is that he was sick most of my life with him, yet

he tried to carry his load on the farm and taught me to carry mine. I'll never forget our "chopping out corn" together and of course getting much advice along the way. Dad was the most patient person I have ever known; he was considerate, firm, caring, loving and hospitable. When I was 4-5 we walked home from church. We got within view of the house when I cried for him to carry me home. Instead he switched me home and then I ran back to the place where I started crying. He let me stay there until I decided to come home. When I was 8 he let me shave him with a straight razor and cut his hair with the old manual clippers with my sister throwing a fit for him allowing me to do that. His response, "He has to learn sometime." Also about that time I cried for him to teach me to milk the cow. He said, "fine but when you learn, its your job." Then I cried to get out of it. I cried a lot. I cried for him to buy me a watch. He had no money but told me if I didn't cry for a week or whatever, he would

give me his watch. I failed the test but I got the watch after his death - an Elgin pocket watch, and I still have it on my dresser as a prized possession.

Once he gave me money to buy a pair of suspenders (yeah I wore them then too). It wasn't enough money for the suspenders, so I decided to buy a bag of marbles instead. On the way home I figured he would make me take them back. So I destroyed the tag on them so they couldn't be returned. To my chagrin, he took them and put them in his trunk, and I never did get them back.

Two of his statements have stuck with me. "You can tell the quality of a man by how he treats his animals." "When you go to The Book (Bible) what it says to do is what you do." I live by that rule. I still love and appreciate my Dad.
